# January 12th Speaker

William "Bill" Kane
"Genealogy - More Than Names"

Author and accomplished genealogist William "Bill" Kane will be the featured speaker at the January monthly meeting. After researching his ancestors back to France and Ireland, he wrote and published *Journeys Taken*, relating the history of New France from its beginning in 1605, as told through the lives of his ancestors. He has written over 50 articles which have been published in several genealogical journals. Mr. Kane is now Vice President of the Societe des filles du roi et Soldats du Carignan, Inc. (Society of Kings Daughters and Soldiers of the Carignan Regiment) and regularly contributes articles to their journal, *Sent By The King*. He also has a query and answer column in each issue.

In another book, *The Brothers and the Sisters*, Bill tells the story of two families that left Croatia and immigrated through Ellis Island to Wisconsin. He also serves on the Canadian committee of the Mesa Family Library Center. He recently researched where his 402 immigrant ancestors came from in Europe. Most of the 391 of his French ancestors emigrated to North America before 1700 and he has plotted on a map the 197 towns where they lived before leaving the mother country.

A native of Massachusetts, Bill has made Arizona his home for the past 43 years. He is very passionate about the stories behind the facts. He not only wants to get to know his ancestors but to figure out the 'why' and 'how' as well as the 'who,' what' and 'where'.

# Special Swedish SIG Meeting - December 2nd

Prof. Sam Blixt from Sweden, guest of Alan Strom (one of our SIG members), was the special speaker at the December Swedish SIG meeting.

Sam Blixt, a well-known Swedish Genealogist, visited the WVGS in early December where he made a presentation on "Using Computer Databases to Do

Swedish Genealogy Research." Mr. Blixt is President of the Person och Lokalhoristorisk Forskarcentrum ("PLF" -http://www.plfoskarshamn.se/sv/om-oss/sprak/english/)



in Oskarshamn, Sweden. This is a large regional genealogical society in southeastern Sweden and is known for its work in developing a database of over 5 million names

from Swedish church records, primarily in the county of Kalmar län in the province of Småland, and in parts of Östergotland.

Sam Blixt, formerly a computer science professor, has been a key person in the development of the PLF database together with PLF members. Genealogy is very popular in Sweden and the country has been a leader in digitizing many of its historical records.

Mr. Blixt demonstrated the use of certain key Swedish databases which are available for genealogy research on personal computers and answered



questions.
