

Today we are pleased to honor a long time member of our Society. She is one of a select group of members who are Life Members. We are always pleased to see her at our Membership Meetings sitting at a front table so she doesn't miss a word.

She met her husband in Spokane at a watermelon party in the summer of 1945. Engaged in November of 1945, they had to fit dating in between classes, working and studying. They married in September 1946, and had their honeymoon in Yellowstone Park. Once school was completed, her husband enrolled in the San Francisco Seminary in San




Anselmo, California. Thus began their life moving from Presbyterian church to Presbyterian church in the upper mid-west, preaching to a variety of congregations.

In the information I read about her and her husband, I counted 7 different states they lived in and some they went to more than once. Along the way, seven babies joined the family. The first was a girl, followed by six sons. You can rightfully imagine she had plenty of work to care for their home with 7 little ones to chase, as well as the many responsibilities of the minister's wife.

Finally they got smart and moved to Tuba City, AZ - enough of those upper mid-west winters! While there, her husband preached and helped in lots of other ways to members of the Navajo Reservation. Finally in 1987, now retired, they moved to Sun City and have been there ever since.

At some point she joined the WVGS and has spent many years as an aide, continuing to this day. She's one of the members who can answer just about any question someone may ask.


