"Populating the US Colonies With Convicts"

The West Valley Genealogical Society is pleased to announce that experienced genealogist, Katie Gertz, will be the featured speaker at the May Monthly Meeting. Katie serves as Secretary for the Family History Society of Arizona and as President of their East Valley Chapter. She became her family historian in 2008 and her research has taken her back to her 5th great grandparents. Utilizing her extensive research skills, Katie will present on "Populating the US Colonies With Convicts." Combined with a great need for cheap labor in the Colonies and unprecedented levels of crime in Britain, the British Parliament passed an act commonly referred to as the Transportation Act of 1718. This act gave the courts the option of sending the convicted felons to the Colonies. This promises to be an interesting lecture for the novice as well as the advanced family researcher.

We will be offering ‘Digi-Crops’ at our WVGS Library on the first Wednesday of each month from 5-9 PM. These practice sessions will enable those working on their ‘digital’ books to work with the help of others for ideas, design tips and much more!

Digi-Crops will be set up like our monthly Research Nights: Members and guests pay a \$3.50 fee at the door for a beverage and dessert. Bring your own dinner. Bring your laptop and work in the multi-purpose room OR those who do not have a laptop can use the computers in the computer lab.
