## Aluminum Cans

Membership did a good job in March with about 75 pound of cans with more crushed than in the past. We didn't gain any ground on last year as they brought in 100 pounds. With the higher price for cans last year and the large amount in March, 2015, we are about 80 pounds down from 2015. Hopefully, we will have an even larger amount of cans next month. I totally spaced out this week and forgot the meeting was last Monday. I would like to extend my thanks to Jill M. who delivered all of the cans from the meeting later that afternoon.



The preferred method is to crush the cans before bringing them in the future. This can be from the top down or crushing the cans from the side. At the moment, we are getting a 20% premium for cans that are crushed. They do not want cans that have been flattened by an automobile tire.

***Important:*** Since we can no longer store cans at the Library we are asking members to please store them at home and bring them to the next WVGS General Membership meeting at the church. Your cooperation and help would greatly be appreciated.
