As I reflect back over the past two years as President of WVGS, I am amazed at the commitment of our members to the Society! Many spend several hours a week at the Library, plus time at home planning for committee meetings or looking for a better, more efficient way to do things.

The latest Long Term Planning Committee's report listed as a major concern space for additional books, maps, etc. No one knew at the time that we would receive over 5,000 books when the Arizona State Library closed. Or that we would receive several large book collections from members. Finding a place for everything is critical.

The periodicals are being digitized and will be available on-line. As space becomes available, surname books are being moved to the north hallway. Old financial records from 1995 were scanned and shredded. The file cabinets were used to expand the Surname file and Vertical file. A space was set up for book sales at the Library.

In an effort to make membership annual renewals more accurate and efficient, you're encouraged to first try renewing your membership online via the WVGS store where you can pay via credit card. Remember to sign in first with your member number and password! Add any comments or changes to your information on the renewal order. Our site is secure, but if you do not want to pay with a credit card, you can fill out the membership form online, print out the completed form, and return it to the Society with your check. The form can also be completed and printed from the Library computers.

Important Notice

Recently an Enews was sent out regarding a missing folder with 2 years of obituary material from the Obituary Committee. It remains missing. Shelf Readers sometimes report shelves appear looser than usual. Specific books, maps and obits cannot be located.

Unfortunately for WVGS, because of the misdeeds of a few people, we have joined the growing number of libraries that have found it necessary to institute certain practices in an attempt to cut down on these losses. Books, maps, and other items may be all too easily concealed. It is too late to do something after a loss is discovered.

Our Library has been built over these many 45 years by the generous donations of people who depend on us to provide a safe and secure home for their items to be shared with other family historians. As stewards of the largest genealogical library in the State, based on these very donations, we cannot allow it to be nibbled away.

Therefore, the Board has approved new procedures to prevent further losses:

- Briefcases, large bags, purses, etc. cannot be brought into the Library.
- Approved items are lap tops, keys, wallets, glasses, thumb drives, paper or notebooks, writing supplies, cell phones, lunch bag, etc. A clear plastic holder or large zip lock bag may be used to contain items.
- The WVGS Library continues to retain the right to inspect items. Upon exiting the Library, the Aide will inspect any binders or folders or items.
- Visitors paying the \$5 daily fee will be given a green ID tag to wear.

Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated, as always.

A New WVGS Fundraiser

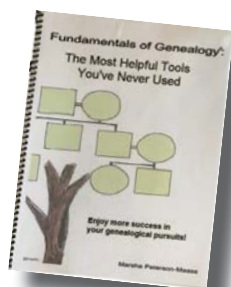

Find-A-Grave Will Change

Findagrave.com has announced that the web site soon will change. Some changes are cosmetic, while others are functional. A map feature has been added.

The home page, formerly just a list of over thirty choices, will become a photograph with a few menu selections across the top. That page will be dominated by the search panel, which will function largely as it has in the past and with the same options for every search box except those related to location.

The current search panel specifies location via pull-down lists for country, state, and county. The new search panel offers a single box for location, in which you are supposed to type the name of a place. As you begin to type a city, county, state, or country that box auto-fills with suggested place names which you can select with a mouse click. Use the American English equivalent of a country name; Germany works but Deutschland doesn't.

The new home page's menu bar goes across the top of the screen. Clicking CEMETERIES takes you to a page that lets you hunt cemeteries in either of two ways. Near the top left of the page is a search box where you can type a cemetery name. This auto-fill box works as above. When you select a name, you see a hit list of cemeteries with that name. Each entry on the hit list displays some facts about that cemetery, and a link to its information page. That page contains a search box that you can use to hunt for a person's name.

Instead of using that cemetery-name search box, you can use the cemetery-place search box to its right. Clicking a place name produces a map of cemeteries near that place. You can zoom the map in or out, and can pan it in any direction. (If the map doesn't display any marker pins, zoom in.) After a name is in that search box, clicking Search leads to a hit list of cemeteries near that place. Use this hit list the same way you use the other cemetery search box.
