Donating Your Research

Don't have a family member ready to continue your genealogical work? Shouldn't all those years of research be useful and available to someone? The answer is YES – someone, somewhere IS interested.

Today, a growing number of people put their research online via public trees or a family website or blog. Even if you have digitized and uploaded every document, picture, and source, it may not be enough. What if that site goes out of business or access becomes restricted? And, if you're like many of us, the tree is there – most of the source material is not. And that's the important stuff!

The West Valley Genealogical Society will accept donations of genealogical materials; in fact, we have a committee that processes those donations and makes them available to patrons of the Society's library. But we may not be the best place for YOUR research. If your research has centered on Massachusetts or Virginia or Iowa, perhaps more people would find your work if it were donated to a local or state genealogical or historical society. Perhaps a state archive or local library would be interested. Ask!

Make sure you check out their rules and requirements. For instance, we require you to relinquish all rights to the information when you donate but every repository has different rules.

Now then, how do you organize what you have? Determine the accepting repository's preferences and follow those. For WVGS, here's what we would like:

1. Make sure there are no personal papers (medical bills, personal letters, invoices, for example) included. If there is sensitive information you don't want shared or information on living relatives, take that out as well.

2. Discard duplicate information.
3. Separate books and pamphlets, especially family Bibles which we can NOT accept, and donate them separately.
4. Pages from books, periodicals or maps are often under copyright; please provide complete citations for each item.
5. Discard census copies and other easily retrieved information, but make sure you have made note of the source.
6. Printed genealogy reports from computer programs should be retained (although excessive duplication should be avoided). Hand-written family group sheets or pedigrees should be retained unless they are duplicated in electronic records. A copy of your tree in GEDCOM format would be most useful.
7. Original copies of land records, wills and estates, letters from/to family members, materials passed through generations, diaries or extracts, etc., should be in sheet protectors for safety. Place any printed transcriptions next to the original document. Materials which are fragile, rare, or oversized should be identified.

Whether in binders or file folders, ancestor pedigrees and/or family group sheets should be first – they are the road maps to the remainder of the material. Think of what you would need if you were trying to use unfamiliar material. If you need assistance with organizing your materials, please call the Library and an Aide will make sure someone on the Collection Development Committee will get in touch with you.
